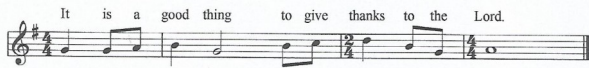

GOSPEL: Mark 4: 26-34

He also said, 'The kingdom of God is as if someone
would scatter seed on the ground, and would sleep
and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and
grow, he does not know how. The earth produces of
